SENSUAL ECOLOGIES: Reaching the interspecific city through somatic ethnography

Sensual ecologies are referred here to the reconfiguration of bodies and environments through sensorial coalescence. Ecologies study relationships, what happen when new relationships are created through uncommon perceptions? Estrangement is a powerful tool in order to change the deep imageries about what compound us, in order to be anchored within the resources of post humanistic way of thinking.

Immersion in the carnal avatars of the communities under these considerations gives us knowledge that is, directly, material for transformation and design.

Design must turn into a time sustained interspecific performance. Somatic research is seen here as a powerful revolution for bodies and environments, for interspecific architectures and cities.

María Auxiliadora Gálvez is PhD in Architecture since 2012 and Landscaper. She is also Teacher of the Feldenkrais Method (2018). She is professor at the San Pablo C.E.U University in Madrid.

Since 2016, she directs the "Platform of Somatic for Architecture and Landscape" (www.psaap.com) and its associated Laboratory (LSAAP).

Between 2006 and 2010 she has been Coordinator for Panama in the International Cooperation Program of Social Housing developed by the Andalucian Government.

In 2002 and 2018 she has been selected for the 8th and 16th Venice Architecture Biennale. She has been distinguished in national and international competitions, highlighting the VI, VII and IX editions of EUROPAN. Her work has been published and exhibited along years in different contexts.

She is author of the book "Espacio Somático. Cuerpos Múltiples" (2019).

She is member of the "International Ambiances Network" (France) and is part also of the research directory of the "Centre for Sensory Studies" (Canada).
